DEAR INVESTORS,

While 2023 was marked with uncertain economic conditions, the Dickinson Area proved to be resilient, with many positive investments and initiatives moving forward.

At the Alliance, we celebrated the launch of a new personal development and networking group called LINK U.P. The group held several social events in 2023 to engage with interested participants and planned for a full slate of activities in 2024. <u>daeda.org/linkup</u>

This time last year, we kicked off our Belong initiative to tell the story of living, working, and thriving in the Dickinson Area. The talent retention and attraction-focused, multi-media marketing campaign is now in production, gathering stories through interviews in collaboration with the business community.

The Talent and Education Task Force is working to build upon the success of Manufacturing Day, with plans to offer a Healthcare Careers event in early 2025. While Manufacturing Day engages area ninth-grade students, the Healthcare Careers event will be offered to tenth-graders, highlighting patient-centered careers and support occupations that are in demand.

The Infrastructure and Housing Development Task Force continues to tackle potential housing solutions. While there are significant challenges, there are new tools to assist developers in meeting the increased costs associated with housing development. The \$15 million Build UP fund, through Invest UP, offers collateral support and infrastructure assistance. investupmi.com/index.php/building-the-u-p New tools through the State of Michigan were rolled out along with the State's Regional Housing Partnership model, using the Statewide Housing Plan as a framework. mshda/developers/statewide-housing-plan

In the community, we saw new retail brands, Aldi, Marriott and Kwik Trip, choosing to invest in the area. Pine Mountain Resort announced plans to expand the resort with a new cabin village, adding 35 new units. The project also includes new trails, culminating in a significant collaboration with Dickinson County and the Dickinson Trail Network. And in northern Dickinson County, the Groveland Mine Solar Project took significant steps in permitting the proposed solar project, gaining approvals from Felch, Norway, and Sagola Townships.

As we look forward to 2024, the Alliance is moving through a leadership transition as I retire, and we welcome Mindy Meyers as the incoming Executive Director. Our focus remains strong and we plan to build upon the collaborative foundation of our organization's work.

My personal thanks go out to all of the Alliance Investors for their expertise and financial support. Special thanks to the Alliance Board of Directors for their commitments and guidance. And to all the volunteers who assist the Alliance through the task force groups, events, and other initiatives. Thank you! We could not do it without all of you!
